Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina. known and designated as Lot No. 57 of Overbrook according to a map or plat of property of Overbrook Land Company as made September 17, 1913, by H. Olin Jones, Engineers, said plat being recorded in Plat Book E, Page 251-52 in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, said lot of land being described by metes and bounds, as follows, to-wit:
