with interest from date at the rate of six (6) per centum per annum until paid; interest to be computed and paid monthly and if unpaid when due to bear interest at same rate as principal until paid; and I have further promised and agreed to pay ten per cent of the whole amount due for attorney's fee, if said note be collected by attorney or through legal proceedings of any kind, reference being thereto had will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said J. C. Johnson, do testify.

in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to ~~be~~ in hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said

Peoples' National Bank of Bruceville, Texas, a corporation for the benefit of Bruceville, under supervision of the Texas State Board of Banking.

All first corals, pieces, purchased by me at Greenville, Greenville County, Texas, of local deposit, were thin slabs, probably for the neighborhood of Jacks Gap, and were collected before 1880 & the last no later than 1885. They consist of small, thin, flat pieces of coral, mostly of the genus *Cyathophyllum*, from which the name was originally described, and of the following genera:

beginning at the corner on the north side of University Drive, 100 feet from the beginning of lot No. 15, running thence along the north side of University Drive and Valley Street, running thence right the line of lot No. 15 . . . 33-15 W. 100.1 feet to a fence post corner at lot No. 15 thence with the west line of lot No. 15 . . . 33-15 W. 100.1 feet to a fence corner at the east end of lot No. 47; thence with the line of lot No. 47 15 x 100.2 feet to a stake on University Drive; thence with University Drive N. 33-15 W. 100 feet to the beginning corner.
