

on the Old White Horse Road about fifteen miles Northwest from the City of Greenville and containing Seventeen (17) Acres, more or less, and adjoining lands with John McCauley and Grace Cantrell and Woody Childs on the North; lands with Grace Cantrell and J. I. O'Shields on the East; lands with J. I. O'Shields on the South and lands with J. I. O'Shields and John McCauley on the West and having the following courses and distances, to wit:
