NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said Fletcher Pinson, Jr.

in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me in hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said

ALL That piece, parcel and lot of land lying and being on waters of Enoree River and Betts Branch near the Bennett's Bridge Road and being known and designated as the S. J. Tarver lands and being the same owned by W. P. Mahaffey at the time of his death. Said land is bounded by lands now or formerly belonging to Thomas Bennett and Nancy Snow and is described by courses and distances and metes and bounds in a deed from R. T. Greer to S. J. Tarver recorded in Deed Book JJ, Page 390 as follows:

BEGINNING On Enoree River on a sassafras and running thence S. 47 3/4 W. 52 1/4 chains to a rock; thence N. 63 W. 12 1/2 chains to an ash; thence to Betts Branch; thence down Betts Branch to Enoree River; thence down said river to the beginning corner.

Being the same property conveyed to Fletcher Pinson, Jr. by W. P. Griffith, Executor of estate of W. P. Mahaffey, deceased, by deed dated March 25, 1948, and recorded in the Office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County in Deed Book N, Page 7, on March 26, 1948.
