Beginning at a stone 3xom about 10 or 12 feet, more or less, east of the present line of the Augusta Road, said stone being on the line of the old or abandoned bed of the said Augusta Road, and running thence along said abandoned bed and along line of lend belonging to S.V. Chandler N. 28-40 W. 8.99 chains to stone 3xnm; thence 3. 76½ W. (crossing the present line of the Augusta Road) along line of tract of land belonging to George W.
