MORTGAGE OF REAL ESTATE

To All Whom These Presents May Concern:

I. H. E. Ensor, of Greenville County.

SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, I/we the aforesaid mortgagor(s) in and by my/our certain promissory note, in writing, of even date with these presents am/are well and truly indebted to FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS & LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREEN-

VILLE, in the full and just sum of Seven Thousand, Six Hundred and No/100 - -

(\$ 7.600.00) Dollars, or for future advances which may be made hereunder, from time to time, up to and including the maximum amount named herein, such advances to be repaid so as to be completed within the terms of the original contract, and so long as the monthly payments set out in the note are paid according to contract, this loan shall not be deemed delinquent by reason of said advances, with interest at the rate specified in said note,

(the terms of which are incorporated herein by reference) to be repaid in installments of

Fifty-Three and 44/100 - - - - - - - - (\$ 53.44) Dollars upon the first day of each and every calendar month hereafter in advance, until the full principal sum, with interest has been paid, said monthly payments shall be applied first to the payment of interest, computed monthly on the unpaid balance, and then to the payment of principal. The last payment on this mortgage, if not sooner paid, will be due and payable <u>Eighteen</u> years after date. The note further provides that if at any time any portion of the principal or interest due thereunder shall be past due and unpaid for a period of thirty (30) days, or failure to comply with any of the By-Laws of said Association, or any of the stipulations of this mortgage, the whole amount due under said note, shall, at the option of the holder, become immediately due and payable, and the holder may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for ten (10%) per centum attorney's fee beside all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note, and to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney, or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by said note, reference being thereunto had, will more fully appear.

NOW KNOW ALL MEN, That I/we, the said mortgagor(s) in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, according to the terms of said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to me/us the said mortgagor(s) in hand well and truly paid by the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, at and before the signing of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, the following described property, to-wit:

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or to be constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, and in Ward One of the City of Greenville, on the North side of West Earle Street, and being known and designated as Lot D, and a part of Lots E, and G, of Map 6, of the Mountain City Land & Improvement Company, as shown by plat thereof recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book WW, at pages 604 and 605, and being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

*BEGINNING at an iron pin on the north side of West Earle Street at the corner of lot now or formerly belonging to Chas. M. McGee, which point is approximately 97.7 feet west from the northwest corner of the intersection of West Earle Street and Wilton Street, and is 9 2/3 feet east of the joint corner of Lots D and E, on plat above referred to, and running thence along the joint line of this lot and the McGee Lot, N. 5 1/2 E. 200 feet to an iron pin which point is 64 feet east from the joint rear corner of Lots C and G; thence along the line of said alley, N. 84 1/2 W. 64 feet, more or less to an iron pin, joint rear corner of Lots C and G, on said plat; thence along the line of Lot C, S. $5 \frac{1}{2}$ W. 200 feet to the joint corner of said Lots C and D on north side of West Earle Street; thence along the north side of said West Earle Street, S. $84 ext{ } 1/2 ext{ } ext{E. } 64 ext{ } ext{feet, more or less, to the beginning corner; the above}$ described lot is the same which Pearl P. Ensor owned at her death. The said Pearl P. Ensor died intestate on January 20, 1951, leaving her husband, H. E. Ensor and her son, John P. Ensor as her sole heirs-at-law. The said John P. Ensor conveyed his undivided one-half interest in said lot to H. E. Ensor by deed dated January 29, 1951, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Vol. 429, at page 393."
