BANNON, His Heirs and Assigns:

All those pieces, parcels or tracts of land situate, lying and being in Austin Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, bounded by South Carolina Highway No. 14, Gilders Creek and South Carolina Highway No. 48 (Bethel Road), as shown on a plat of the property of James P. McNamara and Catherine F. McNamara made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, in April, 1958, said plat to be recorded herewith, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an old iron pin on the northeasterly side of South TRACT NO. 1: Carolina Highway No. 14, and running thence S. 38-34 E. 717.3 feet to an old iron pin; thence S. 47-52 W. 601.7 feet to an old iron pin; thence S. 14-49 E. 625 feet to an iron pin on the northerly side of Gilders Creek; thence running along the northern side of Gilders Creek as the line the following courses and distances: S. 34 W. 154 feet; S. 27-11 W. 132 feet; S. 36-17 W. 190 feet; S. 78-40 W. 129 feet; N. 75-03 W. 226 feet; N. 54-31 W. 129 feet; N. 51-22 W. 197 feet to an iron pin at a point where South Carolina Highway No. 14 crosses the said Gilders Creek near a bridge; thence running along the easterly side of South Carolina Highway No. 14, N. 13-04 E. 233 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 15-31 E. 236 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 20-15 E. 197 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing along said Highway No. 14, N. 23-57 E. 1241 feet to an iron pin; thence crossing said Highway No. 14, S. 38-34 E. 42 feet to an iron pin, the beginning corner, containing 23.80 acres, more or less, exclusive of roads and being known as a part of tract No. 5 of the property of Mrs. Martha A.
