We, Clyde A. Wrenn and Herbert Syracuse by his committee Jamille J. Francis (hereinafter referred to as Mortgagor) SEND(S) GREETING:

WHEREAS; the Mortgagor is well and truly indebted unto Carolina National Bank of Easley,

(hereinafter referred to as Mortgagee) as evidenced by the Mortgagor's promissory note of even date herewith, the terms of which are incorporated herein by reference, in the sum of Sixty Thousand and No/100

DOLLARS (\$60,000.00),

with interest thereon from date at the rate of 5 3/4 per centum per annum, said principal and interest to be \$667.00 on May 15, 1959, and a like payment of \$667.00 on the 15th day of each consecutive month thereafter until paid in full, said monthly payments to be first applied to interest, balance to principal, with interest thereon from date at the rate of five and three-fourths per cent, per annum, to be computed and paid monthly

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagee at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns: "All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville,

on the southern side of the Old Greenville-Easley Highway, in Greenville Township, being more particularly described by metes and $\mathsf{bound}_{\mathsf{S}}$ as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin at the intersection of the Greenville-Easley Highway and the old abandoned road bed of the Southern Railroad, and running thence with the center of said abandoned railroad road bed, S. 58-16 W. 334.3 feet to pin; thence S. 60-05 W. 163.8 feet to pin; thence N. 88-18 W. 151.3 feet to pin; thence N. 63 W. 101.1 feet to pin; thence N. 0-35 E. 126.7 feet to pin; thence N. 88-35 E. 101.8 feet to pin; thence N. 3-27 E. 153.3 feet to pin on the southern side of the Old Greenville-Easley Highway; thence with the southern side of said highway, S. 82-15 E. 562.5 feet to the point of beginning.

Wrenn and Herbert Syracuse by four separate deeds recorded in Volume 475, at Page 38, Volume 475 at Page 41, Volume 520 at Page 60, and Volume 528 at Page 433, respectively.
