NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagee at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagee, and account of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns,

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, being shown as Lot No. 59 on the nathern side of West Fourth Street on plate of Woodside Mills, recorded in Plat Book WW at Page 111, and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds:

"BEGINNING at an iron pin on the northern side of West Fourth Street at the joint front corner of Lots Nos. 58 and 59, and running thence with the line of Lot No. 58, N. 18-22 E. 158 feet to an/iron pin on an alley; thence with said alley, N. 67-30 E. 655 feet, more or less, to pin at corner of Lot No. 60; thence with line of Lot No. 60, S. 22-52 W. 165 feet to an iron pin on West Fourth Street; thence with the northern side of West Fourth Street in a southwesterly direction 76 feet to th point of beginning."
