NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagee at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns.

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, near the City of Greenville, on the northeastern side of Lake Fairfield Brive, being known and designated as Lot No. 68 on plat of Section 1 of Lake Forest Subdivision made by Piedmont Engineering Service July, 1953, and recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County in Plat Book GG at page17 and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the northeastern side of Lake Fairfield Drive, joint front corner of Lots 67 and 68 and running thence with the joint line of said lots, N. 64-30 E. 171.4 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 38-10 E. 93.1 feet to an iron pin, joint rear corner of Lots 68 and 69; thence with the joint line of said lots, S. 55-45 W. 195.6 feet to an iron pin on the northeastern side of Lake Fairfield Drive; thence with Lake Fairfield Drive, N. 25-12 W. 120 feet to the beginning corner.

In addition to and together with the monthly payments of principle and interest under the terms of the note secured hereby, the Mortgagor promises to pay to the Mortgagee the sum of 1/48th of 1% of the original amount of this loan in payment of the mortgage guaranty impurence covering this loan and on his failure to pay it, the Mortgagoe may advance it for the Mortgagor's account and coffect it as part of the debt secured by
