in Section 21, T-5-N, R-19-W, in Marion County, and continuing in an easterly direction, passing through Jefferson Davis and Marion Counties, to the west end of the existing loop at approximate mile post 692.05, located in Section 30, T-6-N, R-17-W, in Jefferson Davis County, all in the State of Mississippi.

## **ALABAMA**

One 42-inch main line loop section (Line "D"), approximately 11.90 miles in length, beginning at approximate mile post 846.80, located in Section 29, T-17-N, R-7-E, and continuing in an easterly direction to the west end of the existing loop, located in Section 6, T-17-N, R-9-E, all in Dallas County, Alabama.

## SOUTH CAROLINA

Two 42-inch main line loop sections (Line "D"), approximately 37.44 miles in length, described as follows:

- (a) One 42-inch main line loop section (Line "D"), approximately 9.12 miles in length, beginning at approximate mile post 1237.58, and continuing in an easterly direction to the South Carolina-North Carolina State Line, all in Cherokee County, South Carolina. Included in this loop section is a main line valve assembly with double cross-overs to the header at the beginning of the loop.
- (b) One 42-inch main line loop section (Line "D"), approximately 28.32 miles in length, beginning at approximate mile post 1148.97, located on the east bank of the Savannah River, Anderson County, and continuing in an easterly direction to the west end of the existing loop, located at approximate mile post 1177.26, Greenville County, all in the State of South Carolina. Included in this loop section are a main line valve assembly with double cross-over to header assembly at the beginning of the loop and a main line valve assembly with double cross-over to header assembly at approximate mile post 1162.72.

## NORTH CAROLINA

Three 42-inch main line loop sections, approximately 21.83 miles in length, described as follows:

(a) One 42-inch main line loop section (Line "D"), approximately 15.28 miles in length, beginning at mile post 1277.70, located in Lincoln County, and continuing in an easterly direction, crossing Mecklenburg
