to a point in the center of Woodville Road, the point of beginning and being a portion of a 43.5 acre tract as shown on a plat of the property of J. D. Nance, Jr., and Ramsey Lollis prepared by W. J. Riddle, March, 1947.

BEING the same property conveyed to James A. Tate and Shirley R. Tate by John Henry Dogan and Kanzadie H. Dogan, by Deed as noted in Deed Book 850 at Page 293, dated August 13, 1968

together with all rights, interests, essements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, the rents, issues, and profits thereof and revenues and income therefron, all improvements and paraonal property now or later attached thereto or reasonably accessary to the use thereto, all water, water rights, and water stock pertaining thereto, and all payments at any time owing to Borrower by virtue of say sale, lease, transfer, conveyance, or condemnation of any part thereof or interest therein—all of which are neither tabled "the property";

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the property unto the Government and its assigns forever.

BORROWER for himself, his hairs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns WARRANTS THE TITLE to the property to the Government against all Institut claims and demands withstorer except any liens, encumbrances, essencets, reservations, or conveyances specified tertinabove, and COVENANTS AND AGEES AS FOLLOWS.

⁽¹⁾ To pay primptly when due any indebtedness to the Government hereby secured and to Indemnify and save harmless the Government against any loss under its insurance of payment of the note by reason of any default by Borowers. At all times when the note is held by an insured leading floorwers shall continue to make payments on the note to the Government, as collection agand for the holder.

⁽²⁾ To pay the Government any initial fees for inspection and appraisal, and any delinquency charges, now or hereafter required by regulations of the Farmers Hone Administration.

⁽³⁾ At all times when the note is held by an insured lender, any amount due and unpaid under the terms of the note, less the amount of any annual charge, may be paid by the Government to the holder of the note as provided in the note and insurance endousement for the account of Borower. Any amount due and unpaid under the terms of the sole, whether it is held by the Government or by an insured lender, may be credited by the Government on the note, and thereupon shall constitute an advance by the Government for the account of Borower. Any advance by the Government as described in this paragraph shall bear interest at the note rate from the date on which the amount of the advance was due to the date to payant to the Government.
