"ALL that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Austin Township, on the East Georgia Road (S. C. Highway 417) near Simpsonville, S. C., containing one acre according to plat of Property of Paul A. and Lola K. Jordan prepared by C. O. Riddle, Reg. L. S., September, 1970, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book 4H at page 35, and having the following metes and bounds according to said plat:
