KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, dated July 31 1975,
THEREIN SIGNED Donald Laigle and Brenda P. Laigle

residing at Greenville County, South Carolina, whose post office address
is 114 Redgum Court, Simpsonville, South Carolina 29681
herein called "Borrower," are (is) jointly indebted to the United States of America, acting through the Farmers Home Administration, United States Department of Agriculture, herein called the "Government," as evidenced by one or more certain promissory notes or assumption agreements, herein called "note" (if more than one note is described below the word "note" as used herein shall be construed as referring to each note singly or all notes collectively), as the context may require, said note being executed by Borrower, being payable to the order of the Government in installments as specified therein, authorizing acceleration of the entire indebtedness at the option of the Government upon any default by Borrower, and being further described as follows:

And the note evidences a loan to Borrower and the payment of the same, made under the terms and conditions set forth in the instrument thereto pursuant to the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act, Title V, of the Housing Act of 1949.

And it is the purpose and intent of this instrument that, among other things, whenever the note is held by the Government, or at the event the Government should assign this instrument with or in advance of the note, that instrument shall be used to pay off the note, but after the note is held by an insured bidder, this instrument shall not secure payment of the note in full to the bidder evidence thereof, but as to the note and such debt shall constitute an independent obligation to secure the Government against loss under an insurance contract in reason of any default by Borrower.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the loans and advances made after the note is held by the Government, or at the event the Government should assign this instrument with or in advance of the payment of the note, to secure prompt payment of the note and all renewals and extensions thereof and any agreement, written or otherwise, including any provision for the payment of insurance or other charge, at all times when the note is held by an insured bidder, there are performed by Borrower's agreement herein to defend and save harmless the Government against loss under the instrument by reason of any default by Borrower, and to make good and at all times to secure the prompt payment of all advances and expenditures made to the Government, with interest, as determined described, and the performance of every covenant and agreement in this note and supplemental agreement, Borrower does hereby grant, bargain, sell, release, and assign unto the Government, with general warranty, the following property situated on the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville.

ALL that certain piece, parcel or lot of land with buildings and improvements thereon situate, lying and being in the Town of Simpsonville, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina on the east side of Redgum Court, being known and designated as Lot 593 on plat of Section 6, Sheet No. 1 of two sheets, Westwood Subdivision, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville, S. C. in Plat Book 4-X, Page 100 and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the east side of Redgum Court at the joint corner of Lots 593 and 594 and runs thence along the line of Lot 594 N. 73-29 E. 148.5 feet to an iron pin; thence along the line of Lots 603 and 604 S. 35-25 E. 100.45 feet to an iron pin; thence along the line of Lot 577 S. 28-57 W. 83.27 feet to an iron pin; thence along the line of Lot 592 N. 66-19 W. 180.78 feet to an iron pin on the east side of Redgum Court; thence with the curve of Redgum Court (the chord being N. 7-27 E. 40 feet) to the beginning corner.

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
