

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof, and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagee at any time for advances made to get for his account by the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Morigagee, its successors and assigns:

All that piece, parcel or lot of land lying and being in Fairview Township, County and State aforesaid, being two lots of land on Goldsmith Road, formerly Cox Street, near the Town of Simpsonville, known and designated as Lots No. 12 and 13 in a subdivision of property of C. F. Putman as shown on a plat there of recorded in the Office of the RMC for Greenville County in Plat Book 1 at Page 114. The said lots are described as follow:

BEGINNING at a point on the north side of Goldsmith Road at the joint corners of Lots 11 and 12 and running thence along the joint line of Lots 11 and 12, N 2 E 208 feet to corner in branch; thence along the branch in a westerly direction an unspecified distance but approximately 120 feet to corner in branch, which is the rear joint corner of Lots 13 and 14; thence S 2 W 256 feet along joint line of Lots 13 and 14 to corner of Goldsmith Road; thence along said Road S 73 E 117 feet to the beginning, and being the same lot of land conveyed to mortgagors herein by deed of Adell P. Campbell of even date herewith.



Together with all and singular rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to the same belonging in any way incident or appertaining, and all of the rents, issues, and profits which may arise or be had therefrom, and including all heating, plumbing, and lighting fixtures now or hereafter attached, connected, or fitted thereto in any manner; it being and equipment, other than the usual household furniture, be considered a part of the real estate.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises unto the Mortgagee, its heirs, successors and assigns, forever.

The Mortgagor covenants that it is lawfully seized of the premises hereinabove described in fee simple absolute, that it has good right and is lawfully authorized to sell, convey or encumber the same, and that the premises are free and clear of all liens and encumbrances except as provided herein. The Mortgagor further covenants to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the Mortgagee forever, from and against the Mortgagor and all persons whomsoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof.

The Mortgagor further covenants and agrees as follows:

- (1) That this mortgage shall secure the Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced hereafter, at the option of the Mortgagee, for the payment of taxes, insurance premiums, public assessments, repairs or other purposes pursuant to the covenants herein. This mortgage shall also secure the Mortgagee for any further loans, advances, readvances or credits that may be made hereafter to the Mortgagor by the Mortgagee so long as the total indebtedness thus secured does not exceed the original amount shown on the face hereof. All sums so advanced shall bear interest at the same rate as the mortgage debt and shall be payable on demand of the Mortagee unless otherwise provided in writing.
- (2) That it will keep the improvements now existing or hereafter erected on the mortgaged property insured as may be required from time to time by the Mortgagee against loss by fire and any other hazards specified by Mortgagee, in an amount not less than the mortgage debt, or in such amounts as may be required by the Mortgagee, and in companies acceptable to it, and that all such policies and renewals thereof shall be held by the Mortgagee, and have attached thereto loss payable clauses in favor of, and in form acceptable to the Mortgagee, and that it will pay all premiums therefor when due; and that it does hereby assign to the Mortgagee the proceeds of any policy insuring the mortgaged premises and does hereby authorize each insurance company concerned to make payment for a loss directly to the Mortgagee, to the extent of the balance owing on the Mortgage debt, whether due or not.
- (3) That it will keep all improvements now existing or hereafter erected in good repair, and, in the case of a construction loan, that it will continue construction until completion without interruption, and should it fail to do so, the Mortgagee may, at its option, enter upon said premises, make whatever repairs necessary, including the completion of any construction work underway, and charge the expenses for such repairs or the completion of such construction to the mortgage debt.
