In the total of payments made by the Montapee under this paragraph, if preceding their exceed the amount of payments actually made by the Montapee for taxes or assessments or insurance premiums, as the case may be, each excess of the total amount of the payments of the Montapee, shall be treated as an additional payment to be made by the Montapee, or deducted by the Montapee. It however, the taxable payments made by the Montapee under this paragraph, preceding shall not be subject to pay taxes and assessments and insurance premiums which have been due and payable when the Montapee shall pay to the Montapee and without necessity to those of the other taxes, or before the date when payment of such taxes and assessments and insurance premiums shall be due. At any time the Montapee shall tender to the Montapee, in accordance with the provisions of the certificate giving timely full payment of the amounts referred to separately thereto, the Montapee shall, in computing the amount of such indebtedness, credit to the amount of the Montapee all payments made under the provisions of this paragraph, in respect of which the Montapee has not become obligated to pay to the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, and any balance remaining in the funds accumulated under the provisions of this paragraph, it shall be paid out under one of the provisions of this montapee relating to a prior use of the accumulated funds referred to if the property so intended, unless after notice the Montapee shall apply at the time of the commencement of such proceeding, or at the time the property is otherwise required to be sold, the amount so in the funds accumulated under this paragraph, remaining in the account, to the amount of principal then remaining unpaid under the original agreement of the parties, or to the amount of principal remaining unpaid under this paragraph.
