- by this mortgage shall become due and payable if, without the written consent of the Mortgagee, the Mortgagor shall convey away the mortgaged premises, or if the title shall become vested in any other person or entity in any manner whatsoever other than by death of the Mortgagor or by and through a corporate reorganization or merger. It is understood and agreed that in consideration for the consent of the Mortgagee to any transfer of citle to the mortgaged premises, the Mortgagee at its option may charge a loan transfer fee and/or require changes in the rate of interest, term of loan, monthly payments of principal and interest and other terms and conditions of this mortgage and/or the note secured hereby.
- 14. That the Mortgagor will keep Mortgagor's books and records in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles covering the operation of the premises, should the same be income producing, and, on demand of the Mortgagee, deliver to the Mortgagee, within ninety (90) days after the close of each of the Mortgagors' fiscal years, an annual statement of operations for the premises for the praceding fiscal year, prepared and certified by an independent public accountant acceptable to the Mortgagee.
- 15. That the Mortgagee shall have the right to enter and inspect the mortgaged premises at all reasonable times.
- 16. That the enactment of any new statute or law by any governmental agency or body, or the legal interpretation of any existing
 statute or law, that in the judgment of the Mortgagee materially interferes
 with the mortgaged premises or with the operation of the business in
 which the Mortgagor is engaged, shall, at the option of the Mortgagor,
 constitute a default hereunder.
- 17. That the Mortgagor will execute and deliver to the Mortgagee, on demand, any instrument or instruments necessary to reaffirm, to correct and to perfect the lien of the Mortgagee to the mortgaged premises.
- 18. That the rights of the Mortgagee arising under the clauses and covenants contained in this mortgage shall be separate, distinct and cumulative and none of them shall be in exclusion of the others; that the invalidity of one or more of the clauses and covenants contained

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
