Inman Master in and for County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand (\$2000.00) Dollars, to me paid by the said H. R. Hortenstine,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said H. R. Hortenstine, the following described real estate:

"All that tract or parcel of land in Greenville County, S.C. about five and one-half (5 1/2) miles from Greenville Court House and containing sixty-eight acres, more or less, bounded by lands of M. L. Marchbanks, the County Parish, E. E. Hudson, H. W. Batson, M. L. Scott, and others. This is the same land conveyed to us by P. E. Hudson and others, March 9, 1910 (see Book 8, pages 78, R.M.C. Office for Greenville County) except the tracts sold to M. L. Scott and H. W. Batson (see Book 9, pages 563 and 400)"

heirs and assigns forever.

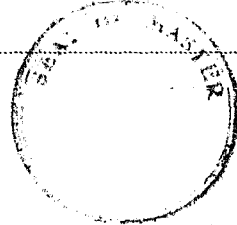
