WHEREAS, O.P. Mills, Jas. R. Williams and G.R. Smith, all of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 16th day of February, 1923, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is The Bonded Storage & Transfer Company
THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.
