

TITLE TO REAL ESTATE

WHEREAS, Harold Clinkscales, W. Clarence Clinkscales, H. S. Cox and
A. L. Goldsmith,

did on the 11th day of March, 1947, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is FINWEAR MANUFACTURING COMPANY

THIRD: That the principal place of business is BATESVILLE, GREENVILLE, R. F. D. #2, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to process cotton, wool, rayon and other materials necessary to or usually employed in the manufacturing of cloth, to manufacture yarn and to conduct all of such businesses as is necessary to or usually conducted in connection with the manufacturing of yarn, cloth and allied textile products.

of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

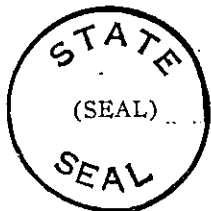
SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 5th day of March, 1947,

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President W. Clarence Clinkscales
as Vice-President, A. L. Goldsmith; as Secretary, H. S. Cox
as Treasurer, W. Clarence Clinkscales, as Asst. Treas.: H. S. Cox

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Anderson

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
