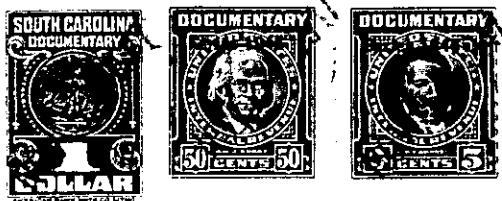

(the receipt whertof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents  
do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said J. H. Johnson

An undivided one-half interest in and to

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township,

County, State of South Carolina, on the West side of Green Street in Sans Souci  
being known and designated as Lot No. 13 on a plat of property of  
T. O. and Bessie M. Lawton, prepared by R. E. Dalton, Engineer, in  
1920, and recorded in Plat Book E, Page 245, R. M. C. Office for  
Greenville County and having the following courses and distances  
to-wit:

BEGINNING at a stake on the West side of Green Street at  
corner of Lots 13 and 14 and running thence with the joint lines  
of said Lots N. 53-54 W. 180.1 feet to a stake at joint corner of  
lots 11, 12, 13 and 14; thence with the rear line of Lot No. 12  
S. 32-40 W. 57.1 feet to a stake; thence S. 53-54 E. 177.1 feet  
to a stake on Green Street; thence with said Street N. 35-51 E. 57  
feet to the beginning corner."
