

privilege of visiting him at his convenience and may make such gifts to him as he sees fit to give.

It is agreed between the parties that in the event the party of the first part shall be incapacitated by reason of ill health or injury, he shall be relieved from the monthly payments as above stipulated until such time as his health may be regained.

It is agreed between the parties that they will not to any extent or any wise interfere with, molest, hinder, or hamper the other in any phase or condition of his economic, social, religious, domestic, commercial, professional, or any other situation in life.

This agreement is drawn in consideration of the premises herein, so that all differences heretofore existing may be composed, and all rights between the above parties from one to the other renounced, and is a final separation agreement.
