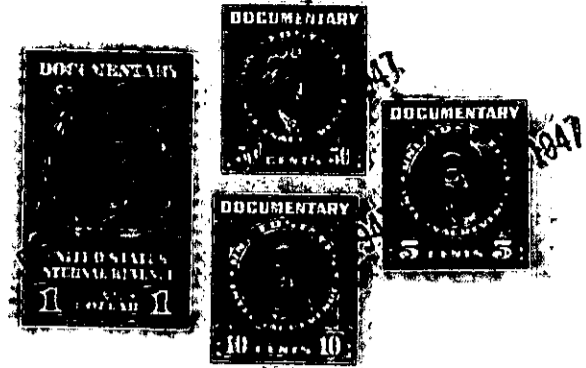

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents  
do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said B. P. Garrett his Heirs and Assigns  
forever:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Fairview Township, Greenville  
County, State of South Carolina near the town of Fountain Inn and being bounded  
by lands of H. M. Givens, Georgia Road, C & W C Railroad, lands  
formerly belonging to G. W. Bussey and others, being a part of the  
same land conveyed to D. M. Garrett and J. F. McKelvey by deed of  
J. F. Anderson in September 1905, said deed of record in the Office  
of the R. M. C. for Greenville County, S. C., in Deed Book 000 at  
page 597, with the following courses and distances, to-wit: Beginning  
at an iron pin, formerly G. W. Bussey's corner, running thence N. 57 $\frac{1}{4}$  W.  
5.11 to a stone on Georgia Road; thence along said road S. 53 W. 8.50  
to angle in said road; thence S. 70 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 1.61 to a stone in road; thence  
S. 7 W. .48 to a stone on right of way of the C & W C Railroad, said  
stone measuring a distance of 50 feet from the center of the tracks;  
thence S. 84 E. 7.50 along said right of way; thence S. 74 E. 2.53;  
thence N. 30 $\frac{1}{4}$  E. 3.54 to the beginning corner, and containing 4.93
