ORDER

This matter came on to be heard before me in open court at Greenville, South Carolina on May 20, 1948.

I find as a matter of fact that through over-sight two small vacant lots hereinafter described in the suburbs of the City of Greenville were not listed in the schedules of the bankrupt and therefore constitute unadministered assets of the bankrupt estate and that it is therefore proper to reopen the bankruptcy, reappoint the trustee and direct his disposition of said assets.

I further find that there is no equity in said property which could become available for disposition to creditors and that it would therefore be an idle and expensive gesture to send the usual notices to the creditors. I find that the premises have since been improved by bona fide purchaser for value, whose rights should be protected and that under all the facts presented, it will be proper for the trustee to disclaim title to said premises in order to remove the cloud upon the title to said lots which was created by the failure of the trustee to administer these unlisted assets in the original proceedings.  
NOW THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED:

1. That the above entitled bankruptcy be and the same is hereby re-opened; that the petitioner, George Norwood, be and he is hereby re-appointed trustee and that said trustee be and he is hereby authorized and directed to
