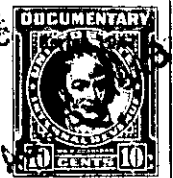
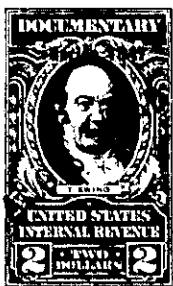

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, being known and designated as lots Nos. 7, 8 and 9 of the property of Hartsell and Townes according to a plat in R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book "G", page 264, and having the following metes and bounds:
