KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS. That I, M. L. Ellenburg

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these  
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Charles T. Merritt

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina, on the Parkins Mill Road in a subdivision of  
lands of B. P. Mitchell and being known and designated as lot number  
4 in Block "A" of that subdivision, a plat of which is recorded in  
Plat Book "F", Page 288, R. M. C. Office, Greenville County. The said  
lot was conveyed to the Grantor by Elizabeth F. Ashmore by deed dated  
March 11, 1948, recorded in Deed Book 338 at Page 383 R. M. C. Office,  
Greenville County. It begins on the Northeast side of the Parkins Mill  
Road on the Northwestern side of a 24 foot Street (Street not named on  
plat) and runs thence along with the unnamed Street N. 46 7/8 E. 191.4  
feet to an iron pin; thence N. 47 3/8 W. 65.3 feet to corner on lot  
No. 3 in the said subdivision; thence along the joint line of lots  
Nos. 3 and 4 S. 52 1/8 W. 190 feet to corner on the Northwestern side  
of the Parkins Mill Road; thence along said Parkins Mill Road S. 43 1/4  
E. 83.3 feet to the beginning corner.
