CHARTER  
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS, J. M. PERRY and F. K. HAYES

did on the 26th day of November, 1949, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration,  
signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is THE INDUSTRIAL COTTON MILLS.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is  
To engage in the business of manufacturing, producing, finishing, buying, selling, importing, exporting, handling and otherwise deal in or with textile fabrics, fibers and fiber products of every kind and description, and the threads, parts and raw materials thereof, and the goods and articles, whether of use, wear, or ornament, into the production of which such textile fabrics, threads, parts or raw materials enter in whole or in part, and especially, but without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the bleaching, dyeing, printing, coating, finishing, treating, embossing, converting and otherwise finishing, working, preparing, treating, adapting, handling and dealing with textile fabrics of every description

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is ten (10) shares, all of which shares shall be Dollars  
payable without nominal par value.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Ten (10)  
of the par value of without par value Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 25th day of  
November, 1949, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:  
C. F. Haynsworth Jr., Marion Brawley, Jr. and J. M. Perry

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, C. F. Haynsworth, Jr.  
as Vice-President, Marion Brawley, Jr. as Secretary, J. M. Perry  
as Treasurer, William Fraser

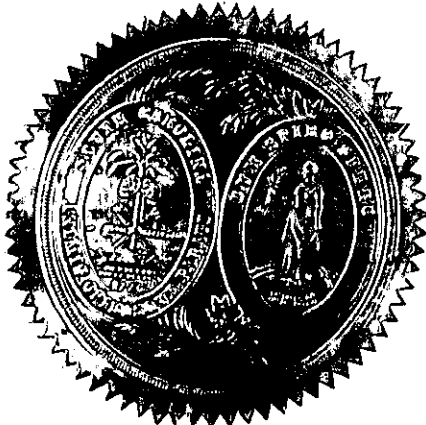
NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1942, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville Piedmont
