(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents

do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said.... Ruth McKinney, her heirs and assigns, forever:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being on the Northwest corner of the intersection of Julian Street and Queen Street near the City of Greenville, in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, being shown as Lot No. 1 on plat of Queen Heights, made by N. O. McDowell, Jr. and J. P. Moore, November 1944, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Plat Book "O", page 87, and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin at Northwest corner of the intersection of Julian Street and Queen Street and running thence along the North side of Julian Street N. 67-39 W. 130 feet to iron pin; thence N. 21-45 E. 39.2 feet to an iron pin at rear corner of Lots 1 and 2; thence along the line of Lot 2 S. 68-00 E. 130 feet to an iron pin on the West side of Queen Street; thence along the West side of Queen Street S. 21-45 W. 40 feet to the beginning corner.

This is a portion of the property devised under the will of Henry F. Means to his daughter, Sarah Alice Means Cely (now deceased) for her life and after her death to Eleanor C. Carter and William R. Cely, who were the only children of the said Sarah Alice Means Cely, all of which will more fully appear by reference to the will of Henry F. Means on file in the office of the Probate Court for Greenville County in Apartment 95, File 25. W. R. Cely died testate November 2, 1947, leaving his will which is on file in the Office of the Probate Court in Greenville County, S. C. in Apartment 536, File 29, wherein he named Annie West Cely and William R. Cely, Jr., as Executors, giving said Executors full power and authority to sell any or all real estate owned by him, and this conveyance is made by said Executors in pursuance of the power and authority conferred by said will.
