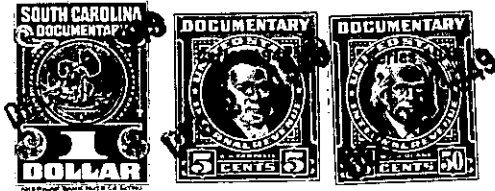

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS. That We, A. L. Williams and Annie G. Williams
in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY Dollars
(\$450.00) Dollars
to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents
by Elbie C. Dockery
(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Elbie C. Dockery, her Heirs
and Assigns forever,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Chick Springs Township, Greenville
County, State of South Carolina, in School District 9-C, being designated as
the major part of lot No. 15 of the E. H. Green property near Paris
as shown on a plat made by W. J. Riddle in April, 1936, and having
the following metes and bounds:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the East side of Green Road or
Street, and thence running along the joint line of lots Nos. 15
and 16 S. 70-30 E., 244.5 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 6-35 E.,
37.8 feet, more or less, to an iron pin and an oak tree; thence
N. 29-30 W., 192.7 feet, more or less, to an iron pin; thence
N. 18-50 W., 67.5 feet to an iron pin on Circle Drive; thence
along Circle Drive, N. 81 W., 9.8 feet to an iron pin on Green
Street; thence along Green Street, S. 13-30 E., 216.7 feet to the
beginning corner, in Deed Book 261, page 417.
