and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged
and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. INMAN,
Master in and for the County aforesaid, to Lala F. Putman for life and at her death to
Inez G. Putman, Johnny W. Putman, Alice Griffin
Putman Cain and T. E. Putman

for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear;

NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, E. INMAN, Master, in and for the County
of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree,

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release
unto the said Lala F. Putman for her life and at her death to Inez G. Putman,
Johnny W. Putman, Alice Griffin Putman Cain and T. E. Putman,

All that piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Oak-
lawn Township, County and State aforesaid, located about $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles from Wood-
ville on the road leading from Old Hundred School House towards Sandy
Springs School House, bounded by lands of Estate of Isaac C. Harper, J. R.
Alberson, Mrs. Mamie Tollett and others and having the following metes and
bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on edge of road, Mrs. Tollett's corner and
running thence S. $63\frac{3}{4}$ W. 16.73 to post oak om3x; thence N. $36\frac{1}{2}$ W. 2.50 to
stone 3x; thence S. 70 W. 21.72 to stake 3x; thence S. $24\frac{1}{2}$ W. 12.40 to
maple 3x; thence S. 46 E. 35.58 to stone 3xom; thence S. $63\frac{1}{2}$ E. 73 links
to stake 3xom; thence N. 15 W. 3.80 to a stake on branch; thence down said
branch to mouth and down creek 7.32 to a stake on bank of creek; thence
N. 22-37 E. 23.93 to stake 3x; thence S. 62 E. 15.65 to an iron pin in a
road; thence along said road N. 30 E. 3.80 to an iron pin in center of cross
roads; thence S. 31 E. 1.64 to a stone 3x in edge of road 3x; thence N.
 $5\frac{3}{4}$ W. 20.80 to a stake 3x; thence N. 80 W. 11.50 to a stake at road;
thence along road N. $30\frac{1}{2}$ W. 5.52 to the beginning corner. Said boundaries
being from a plat of survey made by W. J. Lee, Surveyor, January 6, 1913,
and containing $151\frac{1}{2}$ acres, more or less, and being a part of the tract
