presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said H. E. Chapman, his heirs and  
**assigns:**

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Gantt Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina, about one mile south of the limits of the  
City of Greenville, on the eastern side of U. S. Highway #29, and  
beginning at a point on the eastern side of said highway at the  
junction of the Old Grove Road with said U. S. Highway, the point  
being in the middle of the Old Grove Road at said intersection,  
and running S. 25-07 W.--1095 feet, along the eastern edge of the  
U. S. Highway #29 to a stake on the said eastern edge of said  
highway; thence S. 79-45 E. 454 feet to a stake on the northern  
edge of Old Grove Road; thence 20.6 feet in a straight line to  
center of said Old Grove Road; thence N. along the center of said  
Grove Rd., N. 0-57 E. 1070.7 feet to beginning corner, as shown by  
plat of property of E. E. Chapman, dated October, 1950 by W. J.
