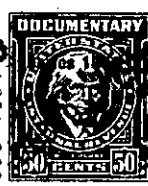

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Dunklin Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing 89 acres, more or less, being part of the land owned by H. L. Thompson, deceased, being bounded on the north by Reedy River, on the east by W. C. Crumpton, on the south by the Dunklin Bridge Road or H. P. McGee, and on the west by L. C. Thompson and W. J. Moorehead, being Lot No. 2 of the Andy Tamsey land. This land is a part of a 129-acre tract of H. L. Thompson, he having sold off 40 acres, more or less, to L. C. Thompson, his son.

The above described tract of land was deeded to Mary A. Thompson by deed dated October 18, 1933, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Book 171, page 455, and the grantors and the grantee herein are her children, and her sole heirs at law and distributees, she having died intestate in 1944.

As a part of the consideration for this conveyance the grantee herein assumes and agrees to pay the unpaid balance on a certain mortgage to the Federal Land Bank.
