Paul J. Wood, his heirs and assigns forever,

All that piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, Greenville Township, on Lindberg Avenue, shown as Lot # 6 on a plot of property of Ladson A. Mills, recorded in the R.T.C. Office for Greenville County in Plot Book "H" at page 117, and having according thereto the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the South side of Lindberg Avenue at the joint corner of Lots # 5 and 6 and running thence along said Lindberg Avenue S. 37-00 W. 40 feet to an iron pin, corner of Lots # 6 and 7; thence N. 53-00 E. 144 feet to an iron pin, corner of Lots # 6 and 7; thence N. 21-28 W. 30 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 69-32 W. 16 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 31-13 E. 24.4 feet to an iron pin, corner of Lots # 5 and 6; thence N. 53-00 W. 118 feet to an iron pin at the point of beginning,
