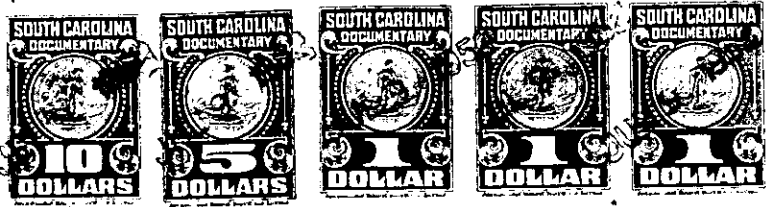

all that certain parcel of land lying and being in Glassy Mountain Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, more particularly described as follows:  
Being in the School District 13 E, about two miles West of Govansville, and on both sides of State Highway No. 11, known as the Howard tract, containing 139 acres, more or less, and the J. T. Lindsey tracts, containing 58 acres, more or less and more fully described in a deed from Evelyn J. Tate to Ben T. Boone, dated November 7, 1925, recorded in vol. 105, page 353, in the office of R. M. C. for Greenville County; also the J. R. Lindsey tract more fully described in a deed from J. T. Lindsey to B. T. Boone, recorded in Vol. 77, page 193, in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County. It is intended by this deed to convey all property which I own in Glassy Mountain Township, Greenville County, devised to me under the Will of B. T. Boone, which Will is duly probated in Spartanburg County, South Carolina. This deed also conveys, if not included in the above description, a tract of land containing 56 acres more or less described in a deed from E. Inman to Evelyn J. Tate dated August 5, 1946, recorded in Vol. 297, page 28, R. M. C. office for Greenville County.

There is excepted from this conveyance certain tracts of land sold under a foreclosure proceeding under the mortgage given by E. J. Shankle to M. C. Caldwell and the tract of land described in the foreclosure proceeding of G. M. Riddle vs. C. S. West and B. C. Atkins.
