CHARTER 148  
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS, J. M. PERRY AND M. E. LEATHERS

both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 2nd day of September, 1952, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is GRAPHIC LETTER SERVICE

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is mimeographing, lithographing, duplicating, preparing circular letters, compiling and addressing lists and addressing letters and circulars to addressing lists and to do any and all things necessary or incident to such business and in general to have and exercise all the powers, rights and privileges conferred by the laws of the State of South Carolina upon corporations organized thereunder.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) - - - - - Dollars payable twenty (20%) per cent cash, and balance at call of Directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Two Hundred (200) of the par value of Ten (\$10.00) - - - - - Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 30th day of August, 1952, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

M. W. Hamilton, Thelma Ellis and Edith King

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, M. W. Hamilton ;  
as Vice-President, Edith King ; as Secretary, Thelma Ellis ;  
as Treasurer, Thelma Ellis

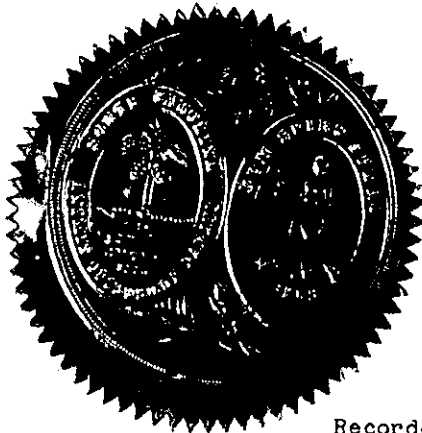
NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1942, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
