KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, William Oliver Bensch, Jr., 6909301, AD3, US Navy, a legal resident of Jackson, County of Aiken, State of South Carolina, in anticipation of being stationed at a point far distant from South Carolina in connection with my duties in the U. S. Navy, have constituted and appointed and do hereby constitute and appoint my wife, Joan Davis Bensch, presently residing at Jackson, South Carolina, as my true and lawful agent and attorney in fact, giving and granting unto my said attorney full power and authority, for me and in my stead, to sell and convey property, real and personal, to execute instruments of writing and to receive for me any deeds or other conveyances of property both personal and real, to execute contracts and to transact any and every kind of business that I could transact for myself including the collection and payment of money, she my said attorney, to do each and every one of the aforementioned acts and, in fact, any other act that I could do if I were present and doing the same myself. She to have full power in my stead to do them.

THE AFORESAID powers are to include, of course, the right to deposit money, endorse checks and to draw funds from banks or elsewhere.

THE FOREGOING POWER shall specifically include the filing of claims and the collection of claims for me and in my stead.

IN FACT, she is to do everything as fully and effectually as I could have done myself and any act of hers in doing any of said things as I could have done myself had I been present, are done by her in pursuance of her power, is hereby confirmed.
