CHARTER 1284  
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS, ANNE J. GAMBRILL AND C. M. GAFFNEY, JR.

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did on the 5th day of February 1954 file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is A. J. G. CORPORATION

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to own, develop, lease, rent and otherwise deal in real estate and other investments and to do all things incident to the operation of such business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twelve Thousand (\$12,000.00) Dollars payable in cash at the call of the Directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is One Hundred Twenty (120) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 15th day of January 1954 at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

Anne J. Gambrill; C. M. Gaffney, Jr.; F. D. Rainey;  
and William E. Jetter

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, Anne J. Gambrill  
as Vice-President, C. M. Gaffney, Jr.  
as Treasurer, Anne J. Gambrill as Assistant Treasurer, C. M. Gaffney, Jr.

NINTH: That all requirements of Title 12, Article 1, Chapter 2, Code of Law of South Carolina, 1952, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed has been paid for thereon, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Corporation is a valid corporation according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written Declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter, and I do hereby direct that a copy of the original Declaration be filed in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a place of business.
