ALL that piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the City of Greenville, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, being located near the intersection of the Stone Avenue By-Pass and East North Street, and being a small strip at the rear of Lots 2, 3 and 4 of plat of a subdivision of the property of the City of Greenville on the Stone Avenue By-Pass, prepared by J. Mac Richardson, recorded at Plat Book S, page 90, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a stake at the Northeastern corner of Lots 1 and 2 as shown on said plat and running thence along the rear line of Lots 2, 3 and 4, N. 41-07 W. 75 feet to a stake at the rear corner of Lots 4 and 5; thence S. 19-17 E. 26.9 feet to a stake on the line of Lots 3 and 4; thence S. 41-07 E. 25 feet to a stake on the line of Lots 2 and 3; thence S. 62-57 E. 26.9 feet to the point of beginning.

Lockwood and Haskell James, as evidenced by Will of said E. M. James on record in Office of the Probate Court for Green-ville County in Apartment 606, file 23. Thereafter, Leila P. Burdette died intestate survived by James W. Burdette, Harold P. Burdette, Lucille B. Ellison and Mary B. Frederick as her heirs at law. (See Apartment 630, file 3.) Thereafter, Haskell James died testate on October 8, 1955 devising said property to Rosa Poole James. (See Apt. 641, File 5.)

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Wooten Corporation of Wilmington, a South Carolina Corporation, its successors and assigns forever.

And we do hereby bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Wooten Corporation of Wilmington, a South Carolina Corporation, its successors and assigns, against us—and our heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
