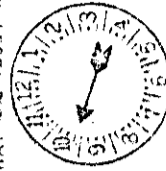

 to compound & mix drugs, pharmaceuticals, medicines and chemicals of every
 sort and kind. To purchase, sell, lease, acquire, dispose of and deal in
 real estate and interests in real estate; to enter into leases, both as
 tenant and landlord, and to construct improvements on real estate or
 interests in real estate; to borrow and lend money and to give and take as
 security tangible and intangible property or real estate or interests in real
 estate; to purchase, take, receive or otherwise acquire, hold, own, pledge,
 transfer or otherwise dispose of its own shares; to enter into any lawful
 arrangement for sharing profits, reciprocal association, joint venture or
 cooperative association with any corporation, association, partnership,
 individual or other legal entity for the purpose of carrying on any business,
 the purpose of which is similar to the purposes set forth in the foregoing
 enumeration, and to enter into any general or limited partnership, the
 purpose of which is similar to such purposes; and to have and exercise all
 powers necessary or convenient to effect any or all of the purposes for
