did on the 27th day of January, 1960, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is LeBRE ENTERPRISES

THIRD: That the principal place of business is CLEVELAND, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to own, sub-divide and sell real property; to own and operate water and sewer lines, and a sanitary service company; to conduct a general contracting business for the construction of any type buildings and roads; to buy and sell all types of personal property; to take securities for the payment of sums due the corporation, and to sell and assign such securities; to enter into any contracts or arrangements with any persons or corporations conducive to the purposes and objects of this corporation.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00)----- Dollars payable in cash or its equivalent.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Forty (40) of the par value of Five Hundred (\$500.00)----- Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 12th day of January, 1960, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: Richard C. LeBre, Victor LeBre and William I. Bouton

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, Richard C. LeBre ;
as Vice-President, Victor LeBre ; as Secretary, Victor LeBre
as Treasurer, Victor LeBre

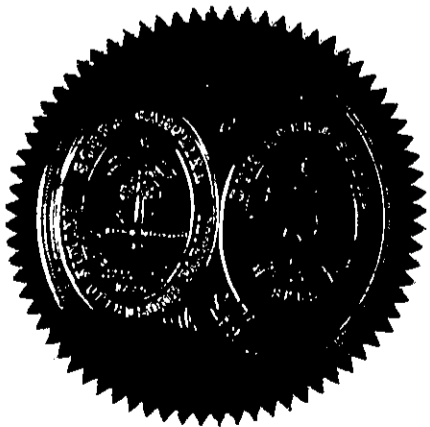
NINTH: That all requirements of Title 12, Article 1, Chapter 2, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1952, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
