all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, in the City of Greenville on the North side of East North Street, and more fully described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point in the line of Lots #1 and 2 on the right-of-way line of the S. C. Highway Department on the North side of East North Street, and running thence along the line of said lots N. 21-45 W. 165 feet to a stake on a 10 foot alley; thence S. 76-30 W. 61 feet 4 inches along said alley to a stake; thence along the line of Lots #2 and 3 S. 21-45 E. 165 feet to a point on East North Street; thence along the right-of-way of said Street N. 76-30 E. 61 feet 4 inches to the point of beginning.

Being the remaining portion of Lot #2, as shown on a plat of property recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book "C" at page 5, after a certain right-of-way conveyance of 15 feet to the South Carolina Highway Department on April 19, 1960, and also the greater portion of that lot conveyed to the grantors by deed recorded in Deed Book 314 at page 131. This deed is executed pursuant to the authority and express conditions contained in a certain Declaration of Trust dated June 30, 1948, and as authorized and directed by the Board of Directors of the Greenville County Chapter of the American Red Cross. That one of the original Trustees, Lindsay J. Forrester, died during the period of said trust, and William I. Bouton was duly appointed in his place and stead.
