

in the State aforesaid, nas granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents does grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said

William D. Aull, his heirs and assigns forever:

All that piece, parcel or tract of land, situate in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, containing one hundred sixty-three (163) acres, more or less, and being bounded, now or formerly, on the North by Thompson and Hendrix; on the East by South Roben Creek; on the South by lands of Abercrombie and Payden; and on the Southwest by Perry Creek, which separates said tract from lands of J. C. Alexander and otherwise on the west by lands of Rogers. The same being more particularly described on a Plat entitled "Wm. D. Aull, formerly Whitener Lbr. Co., Coker Tract, 163 acres", made by John C. Billingsley, L. S. #1161, dated April, 1953, which Plat is being recorded simultaneously with this deed.
