CHARTER BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS,

Louise C. Kellett and Louise Whitfield

both of

P. O. Box 1021, Beverly Road, Greenville County, S. C.

did on the 1st day of December, 1961, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is L. P. INVESTMENT CO., INC.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Beverly Road, Greenville County, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to purchase, acquire, hold, manage, improve, or, to sell, convey, assign, license, release, rent, lease, loan money upon, mortgage or otherwise encumber or dispose of, and in every way to deal with, any and all types of real and personal property of whatsoever kind and nature, including, but not limited to, patents, patent rights, inventions, real estate, buildings, stocks, bonds, mortgages, notes or other securities and obligations, of every kind and description, and to any acts in furtherance of, or incidental and conducive to, the aforesaid objects and purposes; and, to do any acts and things which are now authorized, or may in the future be authorized, by the laws of the State of South Carolina relating to corporations.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars payable in cash or property at the call of the Directors

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Five Hundred (500) of the par value of Ten (\$10.00) each Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 30th day of November, 1961, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: Louise C. Kellett and Louise Whitfield

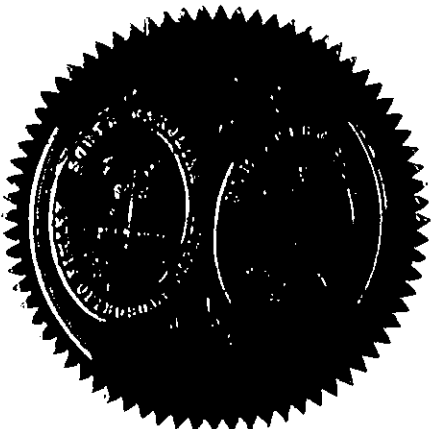
EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, Louise C. Kellett; as Vice-President, Louise Whitfield; as Secretary, Louise Whitfield; as Treasurer, Louise C. Kellett

NINTH: That all requirements of Title 12, Article 1, Chapter 2, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1952, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville Piedmont a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
