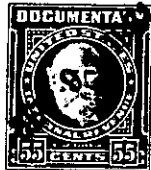
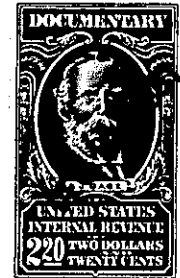

TITLE TO REAL ESTATE



KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That ENVAH GOSNELL
FOSTER, DANCIL GOSNELL, KERMIT GOSNELL, FLENA GOSNELL CROSBY
and LATHEL GOSNELL MORRILL, in consideration of the sum of
Four Thousand Five Hundred and No/100ths (\$4,500.00) Dollars,
to the grantors in hand paid at and before the sealing of these
presents by the grantee (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged),
have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents
do grant, bargain, sell and release unto OHELLA H. THORNTON:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of
land in the State and County aforesaid, on
the North side of 11th Street in Section
No. 5 of Judson Mills Village being known
and designated as Lot No. 63 as shown on a
plat of Section No. 5 of Judson Mills Village
made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, in February,
1940, which plat is recorded in the R.M.C.
Office for Greenville County, South Carolina,
in Plat Book K at pages 33 and 34, and having
according to said plat, the following metes
and bounds:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Northern side
of 11th Street at the joint front corner of
Lots Nos. 63 and 64, said pin being 214 feet
East from the Northeast corner of the inter-
section of 11th Street and Neubert Avenue, and
running thence with the line of Lot No. 64
N. 1-55 W. 90 feet to an iron pin; thence with
the rear line of Lot No. 54 N. 88-05 E. 70 feet
to an iron pin; thence with the line of Lot No.
62 S. 1-55 E. 90 feet to an iron pin on the
Northern side of 11th Street; thence with the
Northern side of 11th Street S. 88-05 W. 70
feet to the point of beginning.

This is the identical property conveyed to Carl
I. Gosnell by deed of Judson Mills, dated April
1, 1940, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for
Greenville County, South Carolina, in Deed Book
221 at page 6. Carl I. Gosnell died testate
on or about December 19, 1949, and devised the
premises hereinabove described to his wife, Annie
L. Gosnell (See Apartment 582, File 17, Office
