CHARTER  
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS,

Albert Q. Taylor, Sr., 2300 Augusta Road, Greenville, S. C.

and

Albert Q. Taylor, Jr., 35 Mt. Vista, Greenville, S. C.

did on the 12th day of April, 19 62, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration

signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is KENDALL CORPORATION, INC. OF GREENVILLE

THIRD: That the principal place of business is 7005 Augusta Road, Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to engage in the purchase and sale of real estate mortgages, to finance through mortgage loans construction of homes, buildings, and other improvements upon real estate, to own, buy, sell, rent, lease, manage, and otherwise develop real estate both as principal and as agent in any and all transactions concerning real estate, negotiable instruments, and to engage in any business not prohibited by the laws of the State of South Carolina. To have all the powers of a corporation under the laws of the State of South Carolina; to do any and all things necessary or proper in the execution of its business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000.00)-----Dollars payable in cash and in property

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is One Thousand (1,000) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)-----Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 6th day of April, 19 62, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: Albert Q. Taylor, Sr., Albert Q. Taylor, Jr.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, Albert Q. Taylor, Jr. ; as Vice-President, Albert Q. Taylor, Sr. ; as Treasurer, Albert Q. Taylor, Sr.

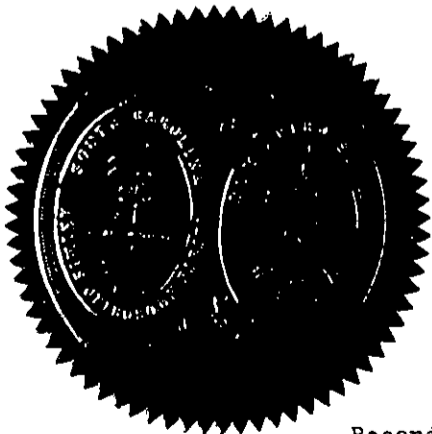
NINTH: That all requirements of Title 12, Article 1, Chapter 2, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1952, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville Piedmont

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
