This is the same property which the grantor conveyed to Kathleen Williams, as Trustee for Wayne A. Springfield, on September 3, 1948 as will appear in Deed Book 359, page 491. These mining rights were conveyed back to the grantor by the heirs of Elizabeth M. Cleveland on November 29, 1958 as will appear in Deed Book 611, page 341, which deed was subsequent to the deed of the grantor to Williams. Likewise, in Deed Book 61, page 145 and Deed Book 85, page 149, the grantor executed a timber deed to Saluda Land & Lumber Company, including the rights over the above described property of ingress and egress, which rights were reconveyed to this grantor by deed of Cooksey Emery on October 7, 1952 in Deed Book 464, page 267.
