M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 747, Page 238, reference to which for a full description is hereby craved, Joseph E. Crosland does hereby grant, bargain and sell unto Clyde E. Satterfield, his heirs and assigns forever, an easement and/or right of ingress and egress over and upon the 20 foot drive as shown on said plat, traveling across the northern portion of Tracts 1 and 2, said easement and/or right to be for the purpose of access to the tract hereinabove described. It is understood that this conveyance is not to create rights in the general public over the said 20 foot drive.
