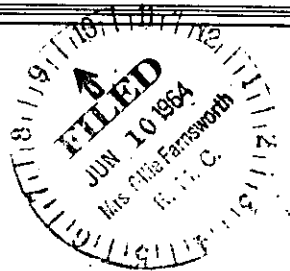

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That WE, SARAH E. COX, KENNETH JOE COX, CHARLES A. COX, LEOMIE C. BRUSTER, ARIZONA C. GRANT, CALLIE C. WILLIAMS, JESSIE C. WRIGHT, SARAH JEAN COX, AND EDWARD COX,

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of FIVE AND NO ONE-HUNDREDTHS, and division of the J. C. Cox Estate Property Dollars

to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by SMILEY COX

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said _____

SMILEY COX, his heirs and assigns forever,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Oneal Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on the northern side of Pine Log Ford Road, and having the following courses and distances, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the northern side of said Road at the corner of Fred Lynn Property, and running thence along the Lynn Line N. 6-46 E. 300 ft. to a point; thence N. 88-46 E. 150 ft. to a point; thence S. 6-46 W. 300 ft. to a point on said Road; thence along said Road S. 88-46 W. 150 ft. to the point of beginning. This being a portion of the property inherited by the grantors and the grantee herein from the late J. C. Cox, who died intestate on August 16, 1940, leaving the Grantors and Grantee as his sole heirs at law. The largest portion of the J. C. Cox Property was conveyed to Homer C. Styles on or about November 18, 1959, as will appear in Judgment Roll No. H-7674.
