acting as administratrix of his estate, deponent listed the house and lot on Liberty Street, West Greenville, South Carolina, as a part of the estate of E. C. Honour through error; that recently when considering an offer to purchase said property deponent found that the title was vested in Honour Coal Company, a corporation, and so far as the public records show no deed therefor was executed by Honour Coal Company to E. C. Honour; that deponent has been unable to locate the minute books or any records of Honour Coal Company; that the property above referred to was conveyed by E. Inman, Master to Honour Coal Company by deed dated February 2, 1930, recorded in Deed Book 149 at Page 374, said property being described as follows, to wit:

"All that certain lot of land in the City of Greenville, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, shown as Lot 3 on plat entitled 'Honour Coal Company', made by Dalton and Neves, recorded in Plat Book U at Page 31, and has according to said plat the following metes and bounds:

"BEGINNING at an iron pin on the southern side of Old Pendleton Road, joint front corner of Lots 2 and 3, and running thence S. 71-25 E. 183 feet to pin; thence S. 88-30 W. 206.2 feet to pin; thence N. 27-20 E. 71.8 feet to the point of beginning."

That if no deed was made by the corporation to E. C. Honour, Ada Findley Honour and Theodore A. Honour are now the owners of all stock in Honour Coal Company, and if a deed were made and not recorded, they would be the owners of the property above described; that no persons other than Ada Findley Honour and Theodore A. Honour have any interest in the property above mentioned, either individually or as stockholders of Honour Coal Company.

That the affairs of Honour Coal Company have long since been liquidated; that deponent has received an offer to purchase the property above described for the sum of \$700.00
