TITLE TO REAL ESTATE & AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, A. L. Henderson died intestate on or about February 23, 1946 leaving as his next of kin and heirs at law Cora Julian Henderson, his widow and the following named children: Wilma H. Haynes, Mary H. Burns, Lucille H. McKeen, Vivian H. Hudgens, Helen H. Traynham, Rachel H. Christy, William M. Henderson, Wesley B. Henderson, Archie L. Henderson, and Harry J. Henderson; and

WHEREAS, the said A. L. Henderson died seized and possessed of a portion of Lot #8 of the property of Greenville County as shown in plat book J at page 25, which is a revision of plat book D at page 161, said property being located on the west side of U. S. Highway 25 between Charles Street and Furman Road; and

WHEREAS, during 1931, the County of Greenville appointed T. C. Gower and W. D. Parrish to act as agents for Greenville County in connection with the purchasing of rights of ways in property for the construction of a new highway to Asheville, which is now the present U. S. Highway 25 known as the Buncombe Road and that said agents did purchase properties to the east of the old highway often referred to as Paris Mountain Road and after the completion of the highway, it appeared that there was an excess of land remaining and by virtue of that fact, the Count of Greenville authorized that said property be cut into lots and sold by the agents.

A. L. Henderson, the deceased husband of Cora Julian Henderson and father of the above mentioned children purchased from T. C. Gower as agent for Greenville County in Deed Book 257 at page 40, dated September 17, 1943, lot #8 on the Greenville County property plat as above referred to and said deed contained the following statement after the descriptive language:

The right is hereby expressly reserved to Greenville County for whom I hold this property as agent, to abandon and close the strip of Paris Mountain Road running from the intersection of the said Paris
